

Modifiable Client Care Plan

California Health and Safety Codes define a Community Care Facility (CCF) as providing <u>non-medical</u> residential care. Residents who require specialized medical care generally may not be in CCFs, though there are exceptions. Exceptions (or waivers) can be granted to a Residential Care Facility for the Elderly (RCFE) for certain "allowable health conditions," which are also referred to as "Restricted Health Conditions" or those requiring "Incidental Medical Services." For an RCFE, these are:

- Administration of oxygen
- Catheter care
- Colostomy/Ileostomy care
- Contractures
- Diabetes
- Enemas, suppositories, and/or fecal impaction removal
- Incontinence of bowel and/or bladder
- Injections
- Intermittent Positive Pressure Breathing Machine (IPPBM)
- Stage 1 and 2 pressure sores (dermal ulcers)
- Wound care

If the licensee of an RCFE chooses to accept or retain a resident with a Restricted Health Condition, they must first obtain an "exception" from Community Care Licensing. Once CCL has granted the exception, you must develop and maintain a written Client Care Plan (CCP).
