


Applying for a License Flowchart

 \mathcal{T} he following is a basic flowchart indicating the steps recommended to obtaining a facility license. We suggest steps that are more time consuming be completed first. This flowchart can be used as a guideline, but your situation may vary.

Decide what type of facility you will open. (e.g., ARF-DD, ARF-MD, RCFE, SFH) Please note that Regional Center facilities have separate requirements. See the Applying for Regional Center Vendorization Flowchart. Complete a CCLD orientation for that category. Orientations can be completed online or in person. **Component I Orientations** Obtain an Administrator certificate or hire an Administrator. Administrator Certification Please note that it is currently taking about 3-4 months to complete an administrator class and receive a certificate.
